HOW TO TREAT AN ELECTRIC SHOCK CASUALTY IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ

IMMEDIATE ACTION

1. Do not touch the casualty with your bare hands.
2. Switch off the electric current - remove the plug or pull the cable free. NEVER try this if the casualty is still in contact with the current.
3. If you cannot break the current stand on a dry, non-conducting surface and use a WOODEN broom, chair or stool to push the casualty away from the source of electricity.

DIAL 999 immediately and ask for an ambulance

A THE RECOVERY POSITION
- if the casualty is breathing

Assess the victim. Check their airways and breathing. If they are breathing place them in the recovery position.

B ARTIFICIAL RESPIRATION
- if the casualty is NOT breathing

1. Open the airway by tilting the head back and lifting the chin. Check for mouth blockages.
2. Pinch the nose closed.
3. Take a deep breath, seal around the mouth and blow into the casualty's chest twice - normally within 1 1/2 - 2 seconds.
4. Remove your mouth and allow the casualty's chest to fall.
5. Count to 5 and repeat the process, breathing for the casualty 10 times a minute.

C EXTERNAL HEART COMPRESSION
- when there is STILL no pulse

1. Lay the casualty on a firm, flat surface.
2. Place the heel of your hand on the lower half of the breast bone and place your other hand on top of it.
3. Keeping your arms straight push down on the chest to a depth of 4 - 5 cm at a rate of 100 compressions per minute.
4. After every 30 compressions administer 2 breaths of artificial respiration.

CONTINUE THIS ACTION UNTIL HELP ARRIVES.

Watch for a relapse - the heart may stop beating again. Cover the casualty with a blanket and keep comfortable.

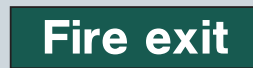
